#### What is Brunello?

- Red wine from the village of Montalcino, Tuscany, Central Italy.
- 100% Sangiovese similar to Chianti.
- The clone in Montalcino is "Sangiovese Grosso" which is called "Brunello".
- Relatively high acid and food friendly like Chianti.
- In good vintages it is impeccably well balanced and can be drunk young or aged for many years.
- Traditionally one of the top 3 red wines from Italy:
  - Barbaresco: "The Queen of wines."
  - Barolo: "The King of wines."
  - Brunello: "The wine of Kings."

#### Italian Wine Law

- Unlike the US, and similar to other European countries, Italy has strict laws about what terms can be used on the label.

## What is the Quality Price Ratio (QPR) for Brunello?

- \$35 \$40: Higher quality than Barbaresco or Barolo or Bordeaux.
- \$40 \$80: Better QPR than the others?
- \$80 \$120: Better QPR than the others?
- \$120 & up: Poorer QPR than the others?

### How do I Age Brunello?

- Buy several bottles of the same wine so when the wine peaks you will still have 1 or 2 bottles to enjoy.
- Buy a wine that gets lots of reviews on Cellar Tracker so you can benefit from other peoples' experiences with the wine. Don't start drinking the wine until a majority of the reviewers say that the wine is approaching its peak.
- Or, buy at least 8 bottles of the same wine and taste one every year starting about 5 years after the vintage. Use your judgement to determine when to start drinking bottles based on the complexity of the wine.
- Most Brunellos will stay at their peak for at least a few years.
