The vineyards on 'Hermitage Hill', are more like a set of 3 south-facing hills that have been planted since 500BC. Famous emboldened wines usually need 5-10 years before you open them. Est 1937, only 137 hectares in vines.	<p>Aromas of black cherry, light toast, ripe blackberry. Full-bodied and fresh, great energy and length. Finishes with herbal notes and dark chocolate; grippy yet fine-grained tannins.</p> <p>One of the smallest and most important <a href="#">Syrah</a> regions of northern Rhone, Hermitage is practically one single south-facing slope of crushed granite, thinly covered with varied, yet well-charted soil types. Many climats (well identified parcels) exist within Hermitage and while some smaller producers make single climat Syrahs, some larger ones blend to make one balanced expression of the appellation.</p>	\$99.99
8	<b>2018 Vincent Paris Saint Joseph</b> Vineyards are in the village of Ardoix about 30 km north of Cornas in the central part of the <b>Saint Joseph</b> appellation.  <b>Saint Joseph</b> is the largest of the Northern Rhone regions, 30 miles long. Wines are unique within the region depending on slope, position of the vineyard and producer! Also, 'Syrah likes a view!'	<p>Jeb Dunnuck <a href="#">JD93</a>          The 2018 Saint Joseph Les Côtes from Paris is a beautiful, elegant wine that shines for its complexity and balance just as much as power and richness. Classy Saint Joseph blue fruits, violets, and damp rock-like minerality all define the bouquet, and it's nicely textured, silky, and elegant on the palate. I love the balance, and while it's going to be hard to resist on release, it should keep for over a decade, if you're so inclined. The Les Côtes is all destemmed and brought up in a mix of used barrels and stainless-steel tanks.</p> <p>Robert Parker's Wine Advocate <a href="#">RP91</a>          The 2018 Saint Joseph Les Cotes is forward, plush and silky, with oodles of ripe cherries. 5	<b>2018</b> <b>Andrew Murray</b> <b>Tous Les Jours</b> <b>Syrah</b>  <b>Santa Ynez Valley,</b> <b>Santa Barbara,</b> <b>Central Coast, CA</b>	<p>Simultaneously bold and balanced, rich and smooth, fruit forward and earthy. It is impossibly dark and full-bodied, without ever going over the top. It is heavily inspired by Northern Rhone Syrah and Australian Shiraz. The aromas and flavors are dominated by black cherry, raspberry, white pepper, forest floor and toasty oak.</p> <p><b>WE93</b> This bang-for-the-buck bottling out of the Central Coast kicks off with aromas of lavender, rosemary and purple fruits that lead into a hearty palate, where blue fruit, asphalt and cracked pepper flavors arise. Strong acidity and elegant tannins ensure cellar worthiness as well. <b>Editor's Choice</b></p> <p><b>JD91</b> Jeb Dunnuck</p> <p>Another value release from this terrific producer, the 2018 Syrah Tous Les Jours is all Syrah, from a mix of vineyards in the Santa Ynez Valley, that was mostly destemmed and brought up in neutral oak. It's deeper ruby/purple hue is followed by a ripe, textured, yet still complex, cool-climate-like Syrah that has lots of peppery herbs, smoke game, and assorted darker berry fruit aromas and flavors. It's California's answer to a terrific Saint Joseph and will evolve nicely for 4-6 years or more.</p>	\$17.99

1	<p><b>2018</b>  <b>Bernard Burgaud Cote Rotie</b>  <u>Syrah/Shiraz , Cote Rotie, Rhone, France</u></p> <p>750ML / 14% ABV750ML</p> <p><b>Cote-Rotie</b> is a tiny appellation (around 200 hectares of vines). It produces elegant, unique wines with prices to match its reputation.</p> <p>Two principal 'roasted slopes' are Cote Blonde and Cote Brune. Cote-Rotie consistently has up to 20% Viognier blended into the Syrah.</p>	<p>Black fruit (boysenberry, blackberry), coupled with savory herbs &amp; olives. Some earthy and rustic flavors, too – irony &amp; sanguine. A delicious wine that's very ageworthy.</p> <p><b>D95</b> Decanter</p> <p>Densely coloured but not opaque. Showing a smoky, meaty, expressive nose with a touch of fresh blood and garrigue herbs. Medium-bodied, you immediately feel the freshness and marked acidity. Extremely vibrant for the vintage. Well-balanced, this is really precise and intense. The oak is well-integrated, well-judged and not excessive, finishing with polished, fine tannins.</p> <p><b>JD94</b> Jeb Dunnuck</p> <p>The 2018 Cote Rotie (100% Syrah brought up mostly in neutral barrels) has a deeper, darker character in its blackberry and currant-like fruits as well as notes of scorched earth, peppered meat, graphite, and crushed stone-like minerality. It's rich and medium to full-bodied, with terrific balance and outstanding length. While the 2017 is upfront and ready to go, this is a longer-term prospect and needs a good 4-5 years of bottle age.</p> <p><b>Rating: 94+</b></p>	\$80.99
4	<p><b>2018</b>  <b>Melville Estates Santa Rita Hills Syrah</b>  <b>Santa Barbara, Central Coast, California</b></p> <p>Five different clones are planted on well-drained sandy loam and fermented 40% whole cluster with skin contact for 35 days. The ripe plum and plum skin that define the palate are seasoned with spiced tomato, black peppered pomegranate, and a brushy heather finish. <b>SJ93</b> The Somm Journal</p> <p>'This deep purple/plum-colored 2018 gives up gamey, Northern Rhône-like notes of peppery herbs, tapenade, smoked black fruits, and violets. The winery has 12 hectares, and since 2009 the wines are tended according to organic growing principles, and the vines and winemaking processes are certified by Ecocert.</p>	<p>“Tongue staining flavors of blackberry jam, black pepper, violet, charcoal, chalk dust and smoke</p> <p>Quite a plush version by Cornas standards, with waves of juicy plum and blackberry compote rolling through backed by typical lavender, rosemary and bay accents that emerge steadily through the racy, iron-tinged finish. 

Pre 1	<p><b>2018</b>  <b>Alain Voge Cornas Les Chailles 2018</b>  <b>Syrah/Shiraz from Cornas, Rhone, France</b></p> <p>The 2018 <b>Cornas</b> Les Chailles comes from a mix of lieux-dits, including Combe, Les Saveaux, Cayret, Les Mazards, Chaillot, and Chapuzes. It was all destemmed and brought up in used barrels.</p>	<p>This wine is marked by elegance, while conveying the typical character of <b>Cornas</b> and Saint-Péray. Pair this wine alongside chicken-liver mousse with sweet wine and cep mushrooms.</p> <p><b>JD95</b> Jeb Dunnuck</p> <p>Offering gorgeous notes of black raspberries, cassis, spring flowers, game, lavender, and pepper, this is pure Cornas goodness on both the nose and palate. Medium to full-bodied and concentrated, with bright acidity, this complex, layered, beautifully balanced Cornas can be enjoyed any time over the coming 15-20 years. Count me impressed.</p> <p><b>WS93</b> Wine Spectator</p> <p>Very racy, focused version with a bright violet note leading the way for damson plum and red cherry coulis notes. 

The goal is always the same - grow and source the finest fruit, do as little as possible to it, and bottle outstanding, pleasurable wine at the fairest price possible.</p>	<p>RP94 Robert Parker</p> <p>Harvested toward the middle of October and 70% destemmed, the 2012 Syrah Sierra Mar Vineyard spent 16 months in 23% new French oak prior to bottling. It has a broad, textured and full-bodied profile and knocks it out of the park with its black raspberry, cassis, violets, licorice and crushed flower nuances on the nose. Winegrowers and horses take shelter from time to time. The Maison Bleue still serves as a shelter for their grapes to dry the straw wine when they produce it. A new life in the respect of traditions</p>	<p><b>RP96</b> Robert Parker  A superb Maison Bleue, the 2019 Hermitage La Maison Bleue seamlessly blends cherries and cassis into a purple mashup of fruit carried on rich, velvety waves of texture. Full-bodied and intense, it finishes complex and savory, adding notes of olive, clove and cedar on the long, luxurious finish. Already approachable, Best after 2023.</p> <p><b>JD96</b> Jeb Dunnuck Beautiful cassis, truffle, damp earth, and ground pepper emerge from the 2019 Hermitage La Maison Bleue. Coming from the eastern portion of Hermitage Hill, it hits the palate with full-bodied richness, a rounded, opulent texture, building tannins, and a great finish.
